**About the topic and speaker:**

The 2012 International Building Code became the state building code for Georgia on January 1st, 2014, including several state amendments effecting structural engineers. These include new requirements for the structural upgrade of existing buildings, partition live loads, emergency shelters and fire wall stability. Georgia also references the new SEAOG Special Inspection Guidelines which incorporate both 2012 IBC and many material reference standard changes.

Mr. Hutton is a Principal with Uzun & Case Engineers, LLC. He has over 30 years of experience in the design of commercial, institutional and industrial structures. He is the past-president of the Structural Engineers Association of Georgia and serves as the Chair of the ACEC/SEAOG Special Inspection Guidelines Committee.
